Text: *Calculus-Early Transcendentals (2nd Edition)*, by Briggs, Cochran and Gillett, 2015. Access to MyMathLab is required (see the About MyMathLab link on the course web page).

Calculator: Calculators are not allowed on tests.

Outline: We will cover selected sections from chapters 11 through 14. Topics include:

1. equations of lines and planes in \mathbb{R}^3
2. functions of multiple variables
3. vector-valued functions; vector fields
4. partial derivatives
5. gradient vector; tangent planes
6. iterated integrals; line integrals; surface integrals;
7. Green's Theorem; Stokes' Theorem; Divergence Theorem
